# **Pupil Achievements**

A huge well done to all our Year 11s who left their education placements with us in June 23. Here is a look at our pupil results:

- ♦ 48% of pupils passed GCSE English and Maths
- 45% of pupils passed 5 or more qualifications including
   English and Maths
- ♦ 82% of pupils provisionally secured a positive POST 16 destination



## **AP Taskforce**

We are proud that Unity Academy was selected to participate in an Alternative Provision Specialist Taskforce (APST) pilot.

The funding from the Department for Education has allowed us to provide a greater level of earlier intervention/ support for our pupils and their families. Our AP Taskforce consists of professionals in the following areas;
