Over a 100 pupils attended the event who are currently attending alternative education in the city. The pupils had an opportunity to speak to new employers and learn more about different organisations that work with young people.

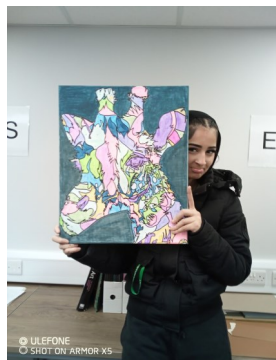
We had 18 organisations in attendance, which included The Army, Royal Navy, Graham Construction, Nottingham College, Nottingham Trent University, NHS and HMRC.
