This term has seen the calendar packed with a range of events for our pupils. Here are the highlights of these events:

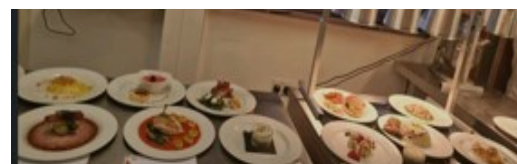
## HMRC Employability

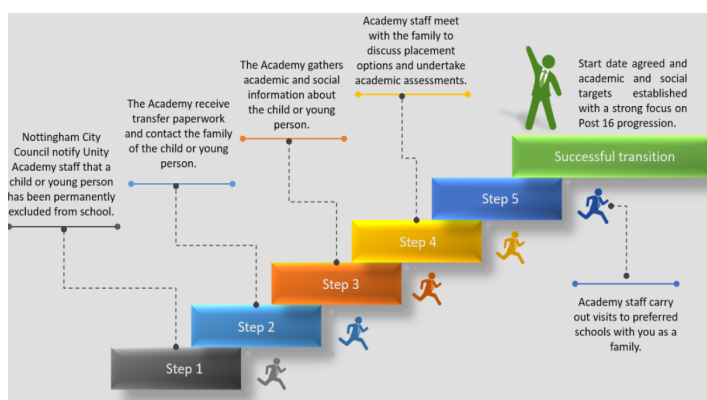

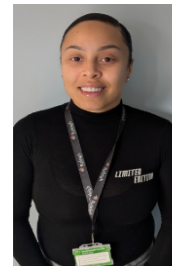
